RIVER ISLANDS TECHNOLOGY ACADEMY SCORES HIGH IN FIRST STATEWIDE TEST RESULTS

Last spring, California held a statewide Assessment of School Performance and Progress testing for grades 3-8 to ascertain students' progress "in a more rigorous education regimen associated with the Common Core standards that were adopted in 2010".

Performance was measured by the percentage of students who exceeded state standards, met state standards, nearly met state standards and did not meet state standards in English and mathematics.

River Islands Technology Academy is among the state's top achievers, with 24% of its students exceeding state standards in English. To put this accomplishment into perspective, across California, only 16% of the state's students exceeded state standards. In addition, another 25% of the River Islands Technology Academy students met the state standards in English.

In mathematics, 14% of the students exceeded state standards, and another 20% met the standards. Almost 300 students, representing grades 3-7, participated in the testing.

The River Islands Technology Academy currently has a student body of approximately 550 students, with 600 students on a waiting list. Priority placement exists for students residing in River Islands or within the Banta school district.

A SPECIAL VISITOR COMES TO RIVER ISLANDS TECHNOLOGY ACADEMY

State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tom Torlakson paid a visit to the new campus of the River Islands Technology Academy on Monday, December 7, where he met with Principal Brenda Scholl and Project Director Susan Dell'Osso, toured several classrooms within the K-8 independent charter school, its state-of-the-art computer and science labs, and the new multi-purpose room.

Torlakson referred to the students' outstanding test achievements while addressing a campus-wide assembly. He asked the students to guess the number of students in California—6 million—and told them that those students attend classes in more than 10,000 schools throughout the state. "River Islands Technology Academy students, you're at the top of those millions of students," he said, to cheers and applause from the assembled students and staff.

Torlakson visited the original campus of the school two years ago. With the school's move to another site within the River Islands master planned community, he returned to see the new, larger campus and its expanded facilities that support the school's STEM approach to education.

During Torlakson's tenure in the top educational post in California, the former State Senator has put together a blueprint for the future of California's schools, which includes a number of sound strategies that hold great promise for students—strategies which have already been implemented at the River Islands Technology Academy, including:

- Strong academics
- Well-rounded curriculum
- Parental involvement
- Qualified educators
- A focus on health and nutrition

Torlakson's commitment is to "ensure that the state provides a world-class education to all students, preparing them to live, work and thrive in a highly connected world." The teachers and administrators at River Islands Technology Academy support State Superintendent Torlakson's goals, and were thrilled to have an opportunity to have him meet their students.
